The BSCI Spring Meeting 2011 will be held on Tuesday 3 May 2011 at the Museum of Science & Industry (MOSI), Manchester.

The use of Cardiac CT & Cardiac MR continues to grow rapidly. This study day is designed to be of interest to both established practitioners and beginners in the field of cardiac imaging. Our aim is to provide an overview of current practice, the setting up of a Cardiac CT service, imaging for cardiac devices and the meaning of accreditation.

In CMR experts will review topics such as ARVC, GUCH and advances in MR techniques. An insight into echocardiography and what happens outside the heart are also within the programme.





Venue information:

The Museum of Science and Industry (MOSI) occupies the former Liverpool Road Station, the Manchester terminus of the Liverpool and Manchester Railway, the world's first purpose-built passenger and goods railway and one of Manchester's most important historic sites. Permanent galleries are spread across five listed historic buildings with collections ranging from early textile machinery to modern X-ray equipment. The latest gallery, Revolution Manchester, is an introductory mini-MOSI, focusing on achievements that made Manchester a world leader in science and technology. MOSI's brand-new conference centre is now open in the Great Western Warehouse and marks the first phase of the Museum's ambitious Revolution MOSI development plans, designed to transform it into a truly world-class cultural attraction. Travel information:

By Car: MOSI is located on Liverpool Road in Castlefield, minutes from Manchester city centre. It is clearly signposted from all main routes into the city – simply follow the brown tourist signs. The nearest motorways are the M602 and the M60.

Parking: Car parking on-site costs £7.00 before 9.00am, £5.00 after 9.00am and £3.00 after 3.00pm (subject to availability). The car park entrance is situated on Lower Byrom Street, which is adjacent to the Museum main entrance, just off Liverpool Road. During school holidays the car park may be busy so please arrive early to avoid disappointment.

By Train: Nearest railway station: Deansgate. It is a five-minute walk from Deansgate to MOSI. Deansgate station is serviced by direct rail services from Manchester Piccadilly and Manchester Oxford Road railway stations.

By Tram: Nearest Metrolink (tram) station: Manchester Central Convention Complex. It is a five-minute walk from Manchester Central Convention Complex to MOSI. Manchester Central Convention Complex is serviced by Metrolink trams from Manchester city centre, Manchester Piccadilly and Victoria railway stations and other parts of Greater Manchester.

By Bus: Bus No. 33 from Piccadilly Gardens in Manchester city centre stops outside MOSI on Liverpool Road. The Museum is also served by the free city centre Metroshuttle Bus – No. 2 service.
